

Camp Lejeune Water Contamination

From the 1950's through the 1980's, people living or working at eh U.S. Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, were potentially exposed to drinking water contaminated with industrial solvents, benzene and other chemical.

Health Benefits and Eligibility

You may be eligible for VA health benefits if you served on active duty (Veterans) or resided (Family members) at Camp Lejeune for 30 days or more between August 1, 1953 and December 31, 1987.

- Veterans who are determined to be eligible to receive VA health care. In addition, care for qualifying health conditions is provided at no cost to the Veteran (including co-payments).
- Eligible family members receive reimbursement for out-of-pocket medical expenses incurred from the treatment of qualifying health conditions after all other health insurance is applied.

Qualifying health conditions include:

Esophageal Cancer	Lung Cancer
Breast Cancer	Bladder Cancer
Kidney Cancer	Leukemia
Multiple Myeloma	Myelodysplastic Syndromes
Renal Toxicity	Hepatic Steatosis
Female Infertility	Miscarriage
Scleroderma	Neurobehavioral Effects

Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma

A Camp Lejeune Veteran does not need to have one of the 15 health conditions to be eligible to receive VA health care, nor do they need a service Connected disability to be eligible as a Camp Lejeune Veteran for VA health care

Presumptive Diseases for VA Disability Claims:

Now is the time to start filing the disability claims if you have been diagnosed with any of the following "Presumptive Diseases": Kidney Cancer, Liver Cancer, Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma, Adult Leukemia, Multiple Myeloma, Parkinson's Disease, Aplastic Anemia/Myelodysplastic Syndromes and Bladder Cancer.
