



Keynote Speaker: Jay Kopelman, author of From Baghdad with Love

Lieutenant Colonel Jay Kopelman began his military career in the U.S. Navy in 1985 and transferred to the Marine Corps in 1992.

In 2004, Marines entered an abandoned house in Fallujah, Iraq, and hearing a suspicious noise, they clenched their weapons, edged around the corner, and prepared to open fire. What they found was not an insurgent, but a puppy left behind when most of the city's residents fled.

Thus began the dramatic rescue of a dog named Lava. "From Baghdad with Love" tells the unforgettable true story of an unlikely band of heroes who learned unexpected lessons about life, death and war from a mangy little flea-ridden refugee.
