It was nine years ago that a handful of VVA members and an outside individual met at VVA headquarters to hash out what we felt was necessary to help get research and treatment for our children, grandchildren and for those future progenies not yet born. In the interim the bill was watered down to exclude treatment and research was called research into the treatment of illnesses for the children. Now, it seems as though Public Law 114-315 passed it is dead in the water. To get action on this law, will funding be deducted from our own disability compensation (as H.R. 299 will be doing to the young vets of today).
