Corporation's Legal Persona Similar to Each Individual's

- If you die without a will, the State determines the division of your property.
- If a corporation dissolves without action, the state usually determines its dissolution.
- The VVA's Articles of incorporation require a dissolution to an organization only as described in IRS 501(c)(3) *and* (19).
- 501(c)(3) prohibits lobbying. 501(c)(19) limits membership
- The term "and" means both IRS requirements apply.
- The VVA cannot give to a veterans organization that wants to lobby.
